

Outdoor Education

Rationale

The <u>Outdoor Learning Environment Standards</u> details the minimum standards for creating and maintaining an outdoor learning environment that provides children with optimal learning opportunities and can be used across government and non-government organisations to support this outcome.

Site leaders must exercise their professional judgement to analyse the risks against the benefit of play activities to optimise learning outcomes for children and young people. These tools and processes are provided to help with that assessment.

Schools need to consider:

- design and planning the space for children's learning outcomes
- design standard for quality and safety
- risk management processes and procedures.

The ongoing maintenance and replacement costs of Outdoor Learning Environments are the responsibility of the site.
